Her Story

Gayla Metzendorf is a Christian author, teacher, and the founder of DivinelyDesigned60, a ministry and online sacred space built for structured spiritual growth rooted in Scripture. Her work exists to cultivate depth, alignment, and restoration in the lives of readers who are ready to move beyond surface-level faith into real, sustained intimacy with God.

Gayla is the author of six books and workbooks. *Back to Eden*, rooted in the story of Job, explores how loss, silence, and suffering shape the soul, and how God meets us in each of those places to restore what was lost. *Before Eden There Was God* and *What Are You Seeing... What Is Real?* are guided, Scripture-based studies walking readers through Revelation, teaching discernment in a world of noise and competing voices. *31-Days in Proverbs* is a month-long devotional for practical, everyday wisdom. *Solomon's Garden* and *Song of Solomon* are contemplative literary works inspired by the Song of Solomon, exploring longing, surrender, and intimacy with God through symbolic storytelling.

Beyond her books, Gayla writes Morning Talk with the Holy Spirit, a 365-day devotional series, and leads The Garden Room, a 12-month guided journey of healing and restoration. She curates a prayer library of more than 350 Spirit-led prayers across 35 topics, teaches verse-by-verse Bible studies, and offers one-on-one faith-based mentorship and healing art therapy.

Gayla's calling is to create spiritual structure: not performance-driven faith, but rooted faith; not shallow inspiration, but lasting alignment with who God designed us to be. She lives out that calling through writing, teaching, and walking alongside readers who are ready for honest, unhurried transformation.
